This Sunday marks the beginning of the season of Advent, which is a period for reflection and repentance in anticipation of the coming of the promised Messiah. In today's reading from Luke's Gospel a gloomy picture is presented to us about the end times, we are told of how people will faint because of the events that will take place, but against this background we are told to anticipate, to pray and watch so that we do not lose our faith. Prophet Jeremiah gives an assurance that a redeemer will emerge from David's lineage.

Today's question: How do I ensure that the spirit of anticipation, prayerfulness and watchfulness is embraced by all those who have resigned themselves to fate due to the unprecedented catastrophes in the world today?

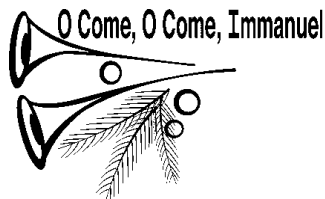

Thanksgiving for the life and faith of holy people

(Monday) Francis Xavier, priest and missionary (d.1552)

Francis Xavier came from Spain and studied at the University of Paris, where he met Ignatius Loyola and joined with him and five others in forming the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits) in 1534. In 1541 Francis sailed as a missionary to India and Ceylon, where he visited prisons and hospitals, conducted worship services among the lepers, and preached tirelessly to the native peoples and to Europeans living there. Later, he set out for Japan where he was the first to preach the Gospel. He then determined to go to China, but had barely arrived there when he was stricken with fever and died. One biographer says that he preached to more people than anyone else since New Testament times.

(Tuesday) Nicholas Ferrar, deacon & man of prayer (d.1637)

Nicholas Ferrar founded a religious community in Huntingdonshire, England, devoted to a life of prayer, fasting, and generosity.

(Thursday) Nicholas of Myra, bishop & philanthropist (d.342)

Nicholas was a native of what is now Turkey and became Bishop of Myra in the 4th century. There are many stories of his love for God and for his neighbour. Nicholas became a symbol of gift-giving, and gave rise to the tradition of Santa Claus.

(Friday) Ambrose of Milan, bishop & teacher (d.397)

(Saturday) Richard Baxter, pastor & spiritual writer (d.1691)

Toys 'n' Tucker

Thank you to Dorothy Harpley and all those who helped collect toys 'n' tucker yesterday at South Hurstville IGA. If you weren't able to contribute toys & tucker yesterday we ask you to place a special donation in the envelopes contained in connections.

Where do the toys 'n' tucker go?

I work for ANGLICARE and run a Family Support Service in Marrickville. ANGLICARE also has several other Family Support Services, as well as a Foster Care and Adoption program, a Family Counselling program, and programs for migrant and Indigenous families, young mothers, and fathers and their children. The families we work with are facing issues such as homelessness, parental mental illness and substance dependence, relationship difficulties, domestic violence and child protection issues. What almost all of them have in common is poverty. The toys that are given during the Toys 'n' Tucker campaign are distributed to those families that ANGLICARE staff deem to be in the most need. For many families, these toys are the only gifts children receive on Christmas Day, and they also afford parents the dignity of being able to give to their children. The generosity of Christians who participate in this program is a great encouragement to us in our ministry. *Lucy Naughton, Program Manager Inner West Family Services, Community Care, ANGLICARE*

Parish Council feedback

Some of the discussions at the November meeting:

- PC is looking for a couple of people who would look out for St Mark's members who are unusually absent, and who may require pastoral contact – please advise Fr David or Fr Andre if you are willing.

LOOKING FORWARD TO ADVENT, CHRISTMAS & EPHIPHANY

The Birth of Christmas – Scripture Reading Isa. 9:2-7

For the past six weeks our Monday night Bible Study has followed this theme, based on the Advent Ethics program from Baylor University, USA, a Christian reflection series in faith and ethics.

As today we celebrate Advent and the start of the Christian liturgical year, Bernard of Clairvaux (1090 – 1153) reminds us of “Christ’s threefold coming: to Bethlehem; to our hearts today and to the world in judgment”.

As the early church began to realise that the Second Coming may not be imminent, over hundreds of years worship practices emerged:

- Recognition of the four Gospels as canon by the mid 2nd century encouraged scholars to find a date to celebrate Christ’s birth.
- In the Jewish tradition great historical people were said to be born and to die on the same calendar days. In an attempt to pinpoint Jesus’ birth date scholars took 25th March (Passover) as the date of Jesus’ conception, then placed his birth nine months later.
- The cult of Deus Sol Invictus (the Unconquered Sun God) was a pagan feast celebrated on 25th December. The Christian church took over this date and in the early 300s the Roman church set this as Jesus’ birth date

In our study notes Kimberlee Ireton speaks of how as adults we come to realise that Advent is much more than just a season of thoughtful preparation and joyful waiting but that we can choose to live a little differently “immersed in the story of Jesus and the story of the Church”.

During the Advent/Christmas season, when in our current society we are exposed to conspicuous consumption, we are challenged to prepare our hearts and minds to celebrate Jesus’ birth and his return in glory, while living in the present Advent and holding Him in our hearts today.

...in 1949, the Revd Frank Byatt of Victoria placed an empty bowl on the dinner table during Christmas dinner. He asked everyone sitting at the table with him to think about their good fortune and their safe, happy lives and then asked them to think about those around the world who were not safe and happy and had to go without. He asked each person to put in the bowl a gift to represent the value of their Christmas dinner, and asked members of his congregation to host their own meals of this kind. This was the very

first Christmas Bowl and it raised money to support eastern European refugees arriving in Australia who had been displaced from their homes due to World War II. More than 60 years later, your gifts continue to help people affected by conflict and poverty around the world.

20th anniversary of women priests in Australia

The Primate of the Anglican Church (23RD November) offered his praise for women bishops in Australia. In the twentieth year since the first ordination of female priests in Australia, The Most Reverend Dr Phillip Aspinall said he is proud of what has been achieved since 1992. "It hasn't been an easy journey to get to this point and while there are still some who take a contrary view, I am pleased to see the journeys of women priests now reaching into some of the highest levels of clerical office in Australia," Dr Aspinall said. "These include Bishops Barbara Darling from Melbourne, Genieve Blackwell from Wagga Wagga and Kay Goldsworthy from Perth, all of whom exercise greatly valued ministries and are excellent role models." This statement of support from the Australian Primate comes as the General Synod of the Church of England in the UK has voted not to allow women to become bishops. While the Anglican Church of Australia and the Church of England are closely related, they are governed separately and function independently of each other. "It has now been over four years since the Australian church paved the way for women bishops and I hope that one day soon the Church of England will also benefit from the ministry of bishops who are women." Dr Aspinall said. Archbishop Aspinall called on Anglicans in Australia to pray for the Church of England as it moves through this difficult period.
