Schubert says it is six months since Earth Hour. He says St Mark's Anglican Church in South Hurstville is an 'EcoChurch'. He introduces lay person Bruce Cooke. Schubert says Rev Chris Albany was inspired by Earth Hour to ask parishioners to act to help the environment. Cooke says Earth Hour was symbolic. They established the recycling of magazines to go to prisoners and recycling toner cartridges, mobile phones and candles. They have raised about \$4,000 for a water tank for the kindergarten on site and they will consider purchasing Green Power.

He says people have been asked to pledge that they will act to help the environment. He says it is a holistic approach and that we need to be caretakers of God's creation. He says Maroubra Junction Uniting Church has also taken up the cause. He says about 20 families have made the pledge but there are some yet to be convinced. He says 'EcoChurch' is their brand but 'eco congregation' is another international brand. He says the outcomes will be changed behaviours with parishioners and in the community.
